Looking forward to 2014




As we move into the new year, we're excited to be bringing even more arts experiences to our community. The Lanesboro Arts Campus project aims to





Highlights of Success in 2013

- 1. Lanesboro Arts Center raised over \$775,000 for the Lanesboro **Arts Campus project**, including \$313,000 from ArtPlace America and \$50,000 for the National Endowment for the Arts.
- 2. Lanesboro was named one of the Top 12 Small Town ArtPlaces in America!
- 3. Our membership campaign helped us reach new members, reconnect with people, and revamp our membership program. We also hosted classical pianist Rebecca Davis at the St. Mane Theatre for our first member concert.
- 4. In October, LAC was invited to participate in the Inaugural Innovation Summit for Arts & Culture in Denver. John, Courtney, and Joe O'Connor attended on behalf of LAC, engaging with some of the country's most innovative arts organizations.
- 5. John presented the work and vision of LAC at a number of con**ferences**, including a keynote speech at the Rural Arts & Culture Summit in Morris, MN, and sessions at the Americans for the Arts Annual Convention in Pittsburgh, the Innovation Summit in Denver, the Kentucky Arts Council's creative placemaking event in Pikeville, KY, and an NEA presentation in Brattleboro, VT.
- 6. Courtney was awarded a *Local Arts Scholarship* to attend the Americans for the Arts Annual Convention in Pittsburgh, and Sara was awarded an *Underserved Communities and Field Diversity* **Scholarship** for the National Arts Marketing Project Conference in Portland.
- 7. We started a redesign of our **website**. Keep an eye out for our new look — with increased functionality! — soon.
- 8. Our Juried Sales Gallery supported over 100 artists, made \$136,000 in sales, hosted 9 artist demos/readings, provided capstone space for SEMAC artists, and hosted new work by 2 spotlight artists.
- 9. To fill a need for more arts education in the summer, we started Surprise Sculpture, a new program where kids used upcycled materials to create large public sculptures. We reached 150+ local kids and many unsuspecting community members!
- 10. All of this could not be possible without our 180+ volunteers, who devote countless hours to LAC each year. THANK YOU!
